Un- picker	ESSENTIAL. Very useful for unpicking machine stitches quickly.
Sharpener	NOT ESSENTIAL. Pencil must always be sharp!
Rubber	NOT ESSENTIAL. To erase our mistakes!
Fineliner pens (0.3, 0.5 & 0.7)	NOT ESSENTIAL. For working drawings – unless using CAD.
Hand Sew Needles	NOT ESSENTIAL. A pack is always handy.
Steel Pins (no glass or pearl heads)	NOT ESSENTIAL. Large heads damage the machine/Iron if you forget to take one out.
Clickers Awl (also known as a bradle)	NOT ESSENTIAL. For marking & checking patterns and fabric.
Notchers	NOT ESSENTIAL. The most vital bit of kit in ensuring accuracy with your patterns. I will share mine.
Snips or Embroidery Scissors	NOT ESSENTIAL. Small scissors for use at the machine
Tailors Chalk – square or pencil	NOT ESSENTIAL. To mark fabric
