## **Start of classes**

All classes start on the week commencing Monday 2 October 2023



## 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> year students Block teaching

#### \* Block 1 and 2:

- Beginner level: 2 hours of introductory class per week.

- Other levels: 1 hour of conversation class per week.

#### \* Block 3 - intensive classes:

3 workshops of 3 hours a week. Each workshop is divided as follows:

- 2 hours led by a tutor
- 1 hour of peer practice



## Final year students Term 1 and 2

- **3-hour workshop per week** divided as follows:
- 2 hours led by a tutor
- 1 hour of peer practice

## You will develop your...

- Language skills: listening, reading, writing, speaking
- intercultural skills: culture, society, politics, arts, cinema, literature,...
- transferable skills: team work, research, presentation, critical thinking, etc.




# Assessment for block teaching.

## On the last week of block 3, you will take:

- 1 listening test
- 1 reading test
- 1 writing test
- 1 speaking test

These are very short tests and will be carried out during your normal weekly workshop slots.




## Assessment for final year students

#### Term 1 assessment:

listening and reading tests during the last week of teaching

### Term 2 assessment:

writing and speaking tests during the last week of teaching
